3. Water Expense Increase: Beginning on January 1, 2024, rates in this area will reflect a (C) 1.9% revenue increase (as compared to the revenue approved in Advice Letter 2491) (C) due to higher charges by West Basin Municipal Water District and the Water Replenishment District of Southern California. This caused quantity rates to go up by \$0.1162 /CCF. Amounts collected from this quantity rate increase will be tracked in a (C) balancing account, as required by Section 792.5 of the Public Utilities Code. Monthly service charges also went up, with the charge for a 5/8 x <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-inch meter increasing by \$0.26. (C)
